Title: MEETING GOD ON THE MOUNTAINS, MATTHEW 17:1-9 (Chatham, NJ; 03/02/14, AM) [D – Order of Space Description]

Theme: God has revealed himself over and over again on mountains, and Jesus climaxes God's movement on the mountains by revealing his glory to Peter, James and John.

Purpose: To demonstrate the revelations that have taken place on mountains, and to inspire us to live godly lives accordingly.

Introduction:

- 1. Think of the most breath-taking mountain view you have ever seen.
- 2. Are you aware how often mountains figure into God's revelations?
- 3. The mountains aren't necessarily more holy than any other place, but God has chosen several of them to reveal Himself.
- 4. What do we see when we read about these experiences where God revealed himself?

I. Abraham's Faith, Genesis 22

- A. Isaac offered on Mt. Moriah
 - 1. Abraham had to travel for three days to get to a mountain
 - 2. In verses 9-14, we see that Abraham was willing to offer his son
 - 3. He encounters an experience with the living God
 - 4. Hebrews 11:17-19 tells us what he was thinking
 - 5. We see: faith, complete and total trust in God
- B. 2 Samuel 24, 1 Chronicles 22:1, 2 Chronicles 3:1
 - 1. David finds a place to offer sacrifices of atonement
 - 2. It eventually becomes the site of the temple
 - 3. As it turns out, it is Mt. Moriah, the place where Abraham demonstrated faith
 - 4. **We see**: atonement, a place of worship and prayer, God establishing his promises of the covenant with Abraham

II. Moses on the Mountain

- A. He receives the Law
 - 1. God prepared Israel to encounter his majesty and power, Ex. 20:18-21
 - 2. Moses receives the Law on the mountain, 24:12-18
 - 3. It seems that he went up several times
 - 4. We see: God's Laws revealed
 - 5. Not the Ten Suggestions
 - 6. God doesn't ask our approval for these
 - 7. We break them at risk to our souls and our eternal destiny
- B. Moses further encounters God, 34:6-9
 - 1. God lets Moses see him, at least in part
 - 2. His name and characteristics are revealed: note several
 - 3. Moses' immediate response is to worship and to plead for mercy
 - 4. **We see:** the nature of God revealed both in his commandments and in the vision granted to Moses

III. Jesus Revealed on the Mountain, Matthew 17:1-9

- A. Peter, James, and John see this
 - 1. Jesus is transformed into his true glory, 2 (reminiscent of what John saw in Revelation 1:12-16

- 2. He is revealed as the lone voice of authority on behalf of God
- 3. After this they saw him once again in his more mundane human form, 8
- 4. Could they ever see Jesus the same after this?
- 5. We see: his transformation through their eyes
- B. Later witness affirms their testimony
 - 1. Jesus commanded them to silence until after the resurrection, 9
 - 2. Peter affirms it, 2 Peter 1:16-18
 - 3. John affirms his eyewitness to Jesus, 1 John 1:1-3, though he doesn't mention the transfiguration
 - 4. James was martyred for his faith, Acts 12:1-2
 - 5. We see: God's Son revealed for the Son that he truly is

Conclusions:

- 1. Through Jesus we know that God is present and at work in this evil world.
- 2. We experience these things through the Gospel revealed in Christ.
- 3. Their witnesses lead us to this message.
- 4. Can you see it well enough to believe it?
- 5. We hear it and accept it by faith; repent of our sins as a result of faith; we confess that Jesus is the mediator between God and man; we are baptized to wash away our sins.
- 6. This new life leads us to a lifetime of obedience and faithfulness.
- 7. Go to the mountains, believe, and come back with eternal life.
