Title: MOST IMPORTANT THINGS, LUKE 10:38 - 42 (Chatham, NJ; 07/17/16, AM) [Pc - Topical]

Theme: Jesus praises Mary for choosing the best thing, listening to him, but there are other "best things" associated with his teachings.

Purpose: To remind the congregation that they need to focus their efforts on the best things: love God, save your soul, love and serve one another.

Introduction:

- 1. Last week was a cautionary tale about substituting religious duties for genuine obedience and mercy toward our neighbors.
- Today we shift focus to balance out Jesus' teaching.
 This story of Martha and Mary turns our attention to the importance of hearing the Word of God, a religious duty of first importance.
- 4. Our religious obligations provide the fuel that energizes and motivates us to love God and love our neighbor: without hearing the Word of God we have no direction and no power.
- I. The One Thing Needful: the Story of Martha and Mary, Luke 10:38-42
 - A. A woman distracted
 - 1. Hospitality at the home of Martha, Mary, and Lazarus
 - 2. Hospitality without grumbling, 1 Peter 4:9
 - 3. Martha was "distracted with much serving," and "anxious and troubled about many things," 40-41
 - 4. Spiritual growth can be choked by well-intentioned over-activity, Luke 8:14
 - 5. She was so bogged down in the details of hospitality that she forgot to enjoy the company of the quest
 - 6. And Jesus is more than just another guest
 - 7. Yet this is what the world does to us: it diverts our attention to numerous nonessentials, some good, some bad
 - B. A woman focused
 - 1. Mary sat and listened to Jesus
 - 2. This was the "one thing necessary," 42
 - 3. Man lives by the Word of God, Matthew 4:4
 - 4. Listening to the Word of God was more important than food and drink
- II. Necessary Things Stemming from This
 - A. Love God with whole heart, etc, 10:27 the first and greatest thing
 - 1. This comes first, love of neighbor follows
 - 2. We must first feed on and live by the Word of God
 - 3. Micah 6:8, the Lord requires us to act justly, love kindness, and walk humbly with God: listening to his Word is the first act of humility
 - 4. James 1:21 receive with meekness the implanted word
 - 5. Philippians 4:8, devote yourself to that which is good
 - 6. Titus 3:8, devote yourself to good works
 - 7. All of this comes from loving God first
 - 8. Without staying attached to the vine, the branches wither and die and loving one's neighbor becomes harder
 - B. Salvation is your goal
 - 1. 1 Peter 1:9, salvation is the outcome of your faith
 - 2. Peter's initial message in Acts included "save yourselves from this corrupt generation," Acts 2:40

- 3. He also exhorts people to "make their calling and election sure," 2 Peter 1:10
- 4. He wants to provide for us an "entrance into the eternal kingdom, 1:11
- 5. If we behave according to the flesh, we will not inherit the Kingdom Gal. 5:21
- 6. All of this relates to entering eternal life after we pass through this one

C. Love and Serve One Another

- 1. Love one another earnestly, 1 Peter 4:8
- 2. Serve one another, 4:10
- 3. Put on love, Colossians 3:14
- 4. Do it more and more, 1 Thessalonians 4:9-10
- 5. Use your freedom to love and serve one another, Galatians 5:13
- 6. By this all will know we are Christ's disciples, if we love one another, John 13:35

Conclusions:

- 1. Stay focused on hearing and obeying the Word of God.
- 2. Don't let the distractions of life pull you away from that.
- 3. The salvation of your soul is at stake.
- 4. Put God first in all things; love your neighbor because God wants that.
- 5. Obey the Gospel first if you haven't done so: this is the first step to a life focused on God.
